6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

- Due to limited scope of changing the curriculum of the affiliated university, college has introduced certificate courses
- Introduction of certificate courses as per the industry requirements
- Skill development and extension activities have been integrated to the curriculum

6.3.2. Teaching and Learning

- Use of ICT is a part of teaching pedagogy
- Internet based assignments and student presentations are complimented to class room teaching
- Teaching and learning are also through guest lectures and industrial visits
- Case studies, group discussion, crossword puzzles are part of learning process
- Students and teachers are encouraged to participate in workshops to update themselves

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- Bangalore university norms are followed in conducting exams
- Online MCQ test, though not mandatory, are conducted for all semester students of all streams
- Internal tests and assignments are also part of the assessment and evaluation
- Slow learners are identified in the process of evaluation and remedial coaching classes are arranged
- EC&CC has been introduced by the BU, participation of student members and report on activities conducted by activity centers are considered for assigning internal marks

6.3.4 Research and development

- Research committee in the college which constitute senior teachers, continue to guide students and faculty member in preparation and presentation of research papers at various platforms
- DELNET and INFLIBNET facility is available for students and faculty members
- Registration fee and OOD facility will be provided to faculty members for attending conferences and also for presentation of papers
- Management honours its faculty research scholars
- Encourage students and faculty members to take up mini projects which is funded by college

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

- Library automation with 'libsoft' has facilitated easy access to books
- E-journals and magazines (shodh sindhu) are accessible to all staff and students along with INFLIBNET (as per UGC) and DELNET
- ICT programme with video lectures on various topics are shown in the library
- Installation of Public addressing System (PAS) in all class rooms for prayer and to make common announcements
- More CCTV cameras to facilitate strict vigilance
- Up-gradation of more number of classrooms with ICT facility
- Campus is Wi-Fi enabled
- ICT enabled State-of-the-art seminar hall was constructed

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

- Assessment of staff is done by taking online feedback from students and by self appraisal
- Faculty development programmes are conducted not only to improve teaching pedagogy but also encourage them to take up research
- New faculty are encouraged to attend workshops in other institutions
- Staff welfare schemes like PF, ESI, CL, EL, gratuity etc are provided to the staff including loan and festival advance facility
- College follows participative management by inducting 2 faculty members into the Governing Council
- All faculty members who have achieved academically or in any other fields are felicitated by the Management

6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

- Every year based on requirement, advertisements are made in leading news papers, in the institutional website and by employee referrals
- Applications are scrutinized by Principal, Director and respective HODs' and candidates are shortlisted based on merit, experience and research potentials
- Shortlisted candidates are called for demonstration and Interview is conducted
- Selections are made on the basis of performance during interview and other parameters laid down by the college and management (research, experience etc)
- Alumni of the college are also considered for recruitment
- 6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration
- College has tied up with professionals, Hiregange academy as our knowledge partners

Best practice – 1

Title of the practice- Environmental protection through Eco-club – *Prakruthi*

Context – Global warming, raising population, increasing infrastructure in terms of building complexes and widening roads has let to lot of cutting down of trees. It has taken toll on Garden city – Bangalore. The government has not much choice, the citizen seem to have limited chance to plant trees, since they live in apartments. Due to this, the primary objective of 'Eco-Club' is to involve more student volunteers in environment related issues.

Objectives:

- To inculcate environmental friendly habits among students and staff
- Conduct community awareness drive that would prevent spread of deceases through clean surrounding
- To collect and dispose e-waste safely owing to the host of harmful metals which may get into our food chain
- Tree plantation drive
- To conduct such activities that would stop degradation of nature and improve the condition of our natural environment

Practice:

Eco-club registered student volunteers who were named as 'Green Ambassador'. These students take active participation in all the activities conducted by eco-club. Periodic meetings were conducted and programmes were chalked out.

Following were few commendable jobs done:

- A marathon walk from Vidhan Soudha to Lalbagh to commemorate 62nd wild life week which was organized by Karnataka Forest Department, Bangalore
- Visit to 'Tent Library' concept at elephant camp, Mysore palace grounds, Mysore during Dussehra celebrations, in which eco-club members functioned as volunteers in various activities conducted for children of Mahuauts and Kavadigas
- Wildlife day was celebrated in which a speech on 'Awareness for wildlife protection' was arranged. Felicitation of three eminent wildlife activists and police officers of forest department was done.

- International day of forests was celebrated in which documentaries on 'Forest Conservation and Environmental issues' were screened
- Visit to Regional museum of Natural history, Mysore and Chamundi hills, Mysore. Gallery of biodiversity, life through ages, early plant heritage of India,, discovery center etc. were visited and film related to wildlife and forest conservation aspects were screened at the Regional Museum in Mysore
- E-waste collection drive was organized over a week e-waste was collected and was given away for safe disposal
- Establishment and maintenance of Herbal Garden at the college campus

Obstacles faced / challenges issues

- Lack of awareness among the students about environment hazards
- Reservations among the students to participate in various activities
- Lack of knowledge among students about the maintenance of plants, especially Herbal garden
- Arranging an appropriate learning resource / platform
- Limited academic exposure about environmental studies

Strategies adopted to overcome

- To create awareness on various environmental issues, documentary films were screened for all eco-club members
- Guest lecturers were arranged on 'Awareness for wildlife protection'
- Competitions such as Essay and drawing competitions were conducted for eco-members
- To provide exposure to students, members were taken to Mysore and encouraged to be volunteers in various activates conducted for children of Mahouts and *Kavadigas*.
- Eco-club members are given the responsibility to maintain Herbal garden at the campus

Achievements

- The eco-members participation at the elephant camp and their contribution as volunteers in various activates conducted for children on Mahouts and *Kavadigas* was published in 'Forest Reporter' newspaper dated 28th October 2016
- Our college herbal garden received prize in the annual Lalbagh show on Republic day

Best practice – 2

Title of the Practice

Theatre Club – Rangantharanga

The Context

College has a unique model - 360-degree approach for the overall development of the individual. This approach will help the students and staff to mould them to be a responsible citizen. With this background, college rejuvenated the theatre club – Rangantharanga, as it would help the students to exhibit their hidden talent with regard to acting. Earlier this club had produced Heroes, heroines, models, singers, music directors, and technicians to the film industry and to the theatre in Karnataka. Taking the queue from this, our institution decided to restart this club.

Objective:

- To provide opportunities for students to exhibit their talent.
- To identify & develop histrionic skills among students at State & National level.
- To give exposure to the members of theatre club to meet & interact with well-known celebrities.
- To help students develop all-round personality by improving their skills in creativity, communication, inter-personal relations, etc.
- To build team sprit & goal orientation that would help them to face the challenges in their personal & professional life.

The Practice

- Inauguration of the club will always be done by a renowned cini artists or by the theatre personality who are very popular among the student community
- Students are informed about the various activities of the club by the way of announcements though the student members
- Professional director will be prearranged to tutor the students with the various technique of acting
- They play will be selected by the director and the approval of the same will be taken by the convenor of the club and also by the principal
- The practice of the play will be held in the college premises after the class hours

- The students are taken to all the competitions conducted by various institutions and organizations
- Stage shows will also be given at various parts of the state for a social cause

Problems Encountered and Resources Required

- There was a significant amount of apprehensions in students about their potentials as an artist
- Initially the students had their own reluctance about missing classes during the competitions and shows
- Appointment of a professional director was a challenge as the students were armatures and required a thorough training before they earn a role in the play

Strategies adopted to overcome:

- An orientation program was given to all the students at the beginning of the academic year about the various opportunities available and the benefits with regard to the club
- Workshop was conducted on various facets of theatre such as acting, voice modulation, makeup, property and set designing and costume designing
- Workshop was conducted by various theatre personalities who had authority in their respective fields and were well known personalities
- Students who participated in the theatre club during competitions and stage shows were given attendance and extra class were taken

Achievements:

- Won 1st place at National level Theatre festival along with 8 prizes in various categories at Jain college, Bangalore
- 5 of the students participated at National Theatre festival at Orissa
- Won best overall Rangotri Trophy and 3rd prize including 9 other prizes in various categories at Rangotri State level competition
- Runners-up at Kalarava Enact Drama Festival
