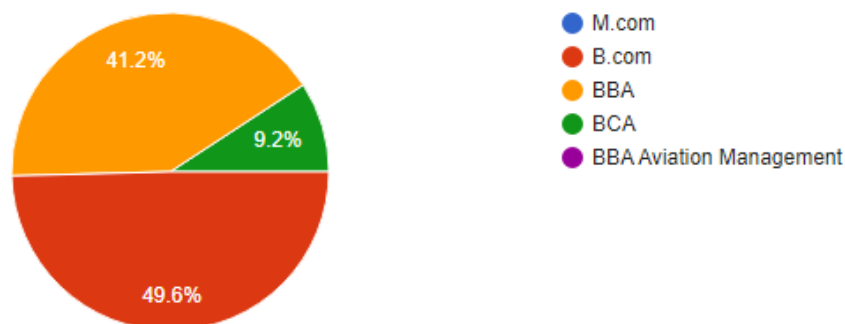
Data Collection and analysis

359 responses

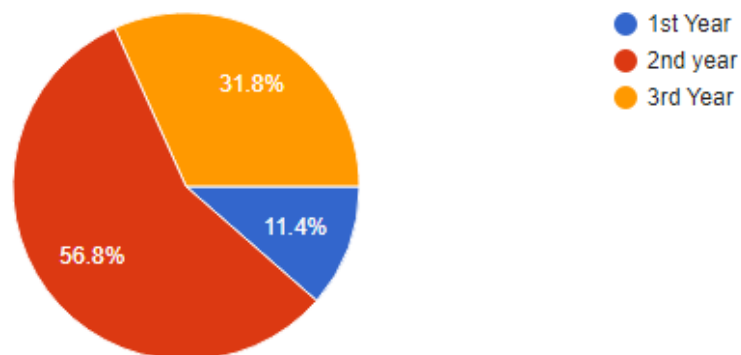


Analysis

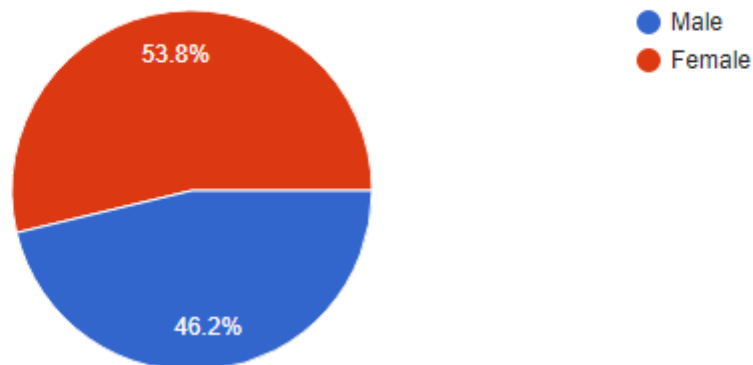


Analysis

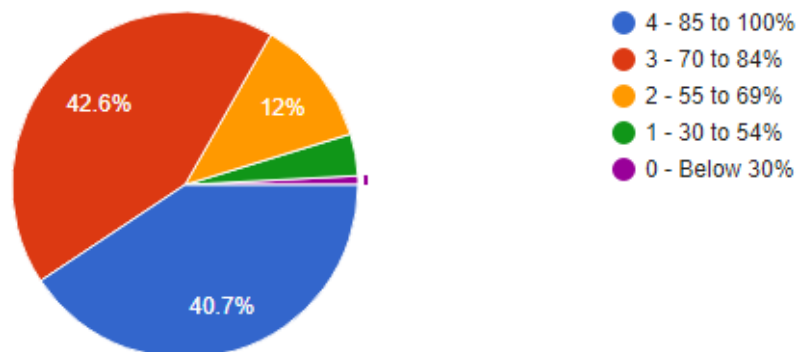


Analysis

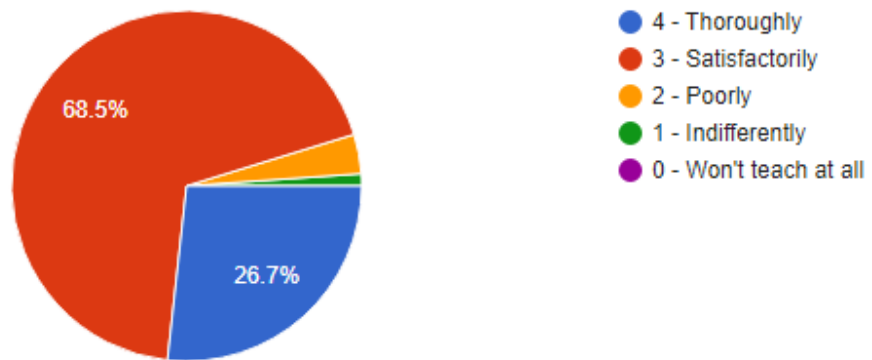


Analysis

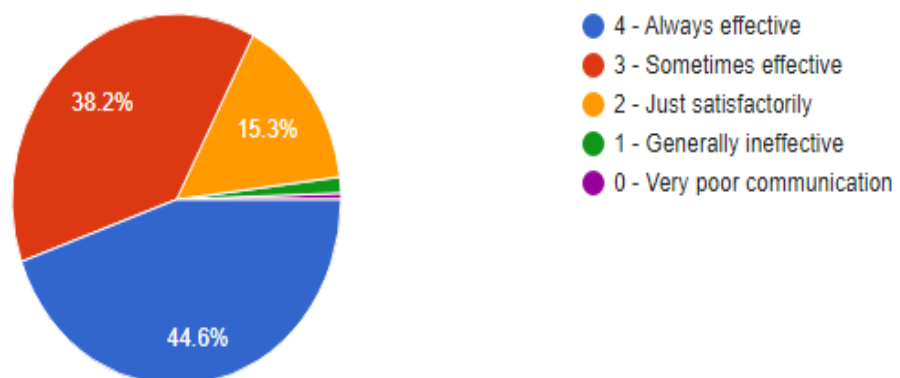


Analysis

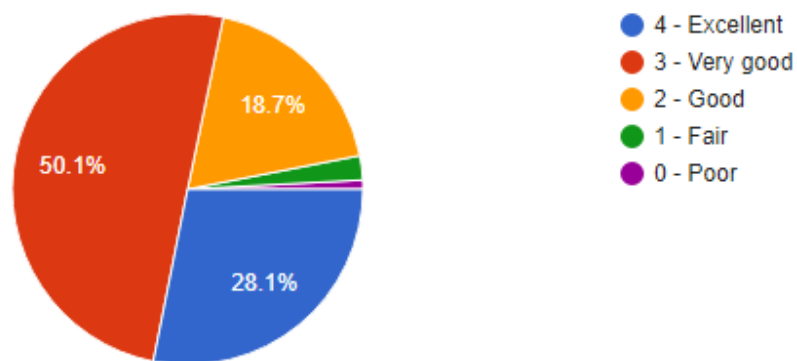
Analysis

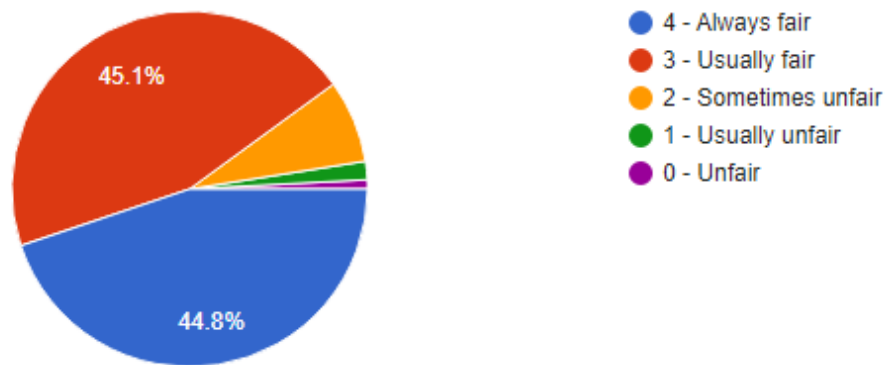


Analysis

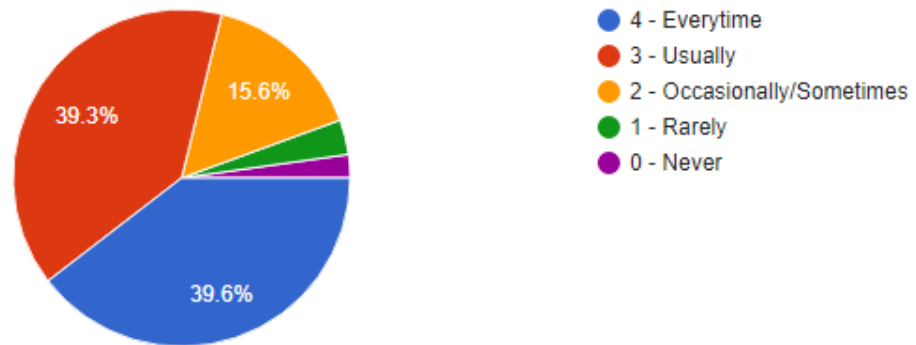


Analysis

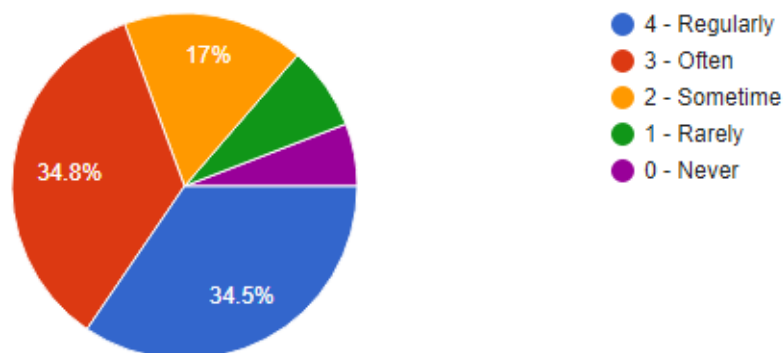


Analysis

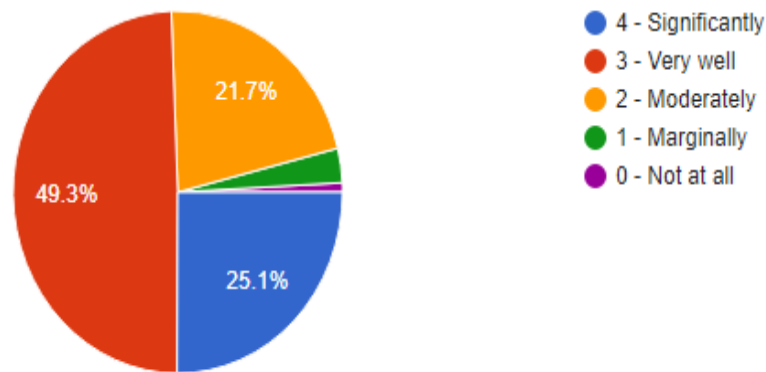
Analysis

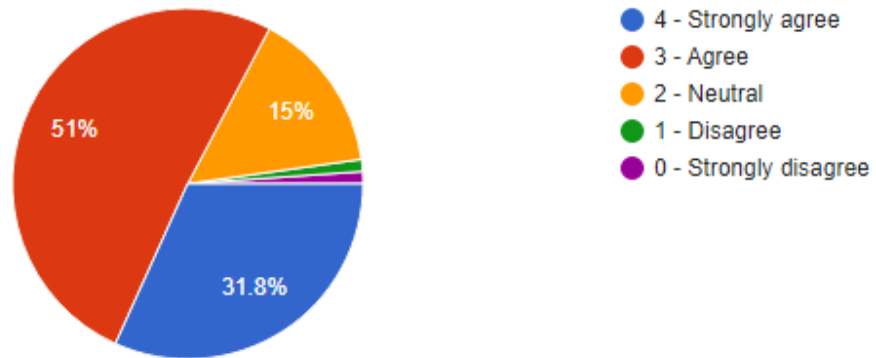


Analysis

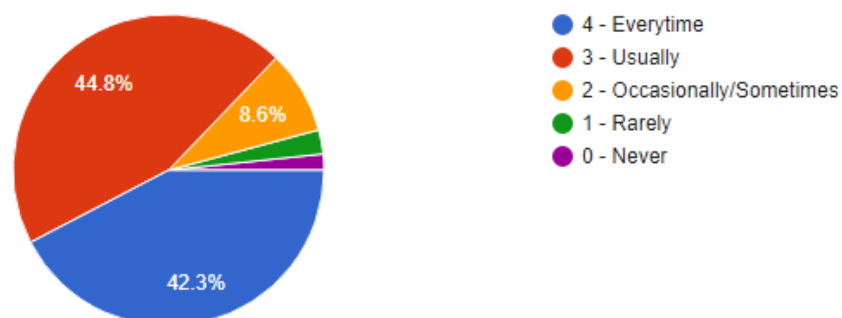


Analysis

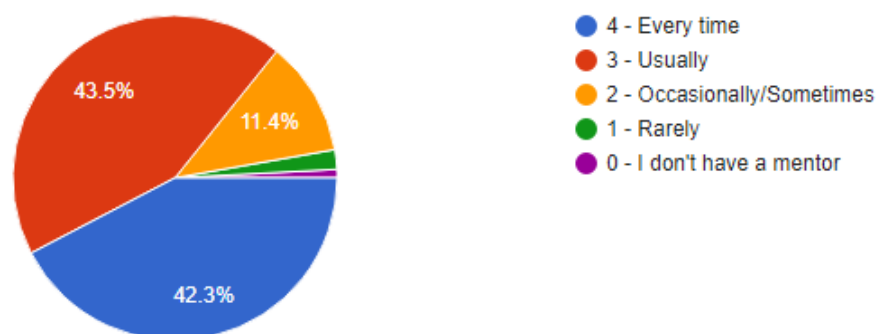


Analysis

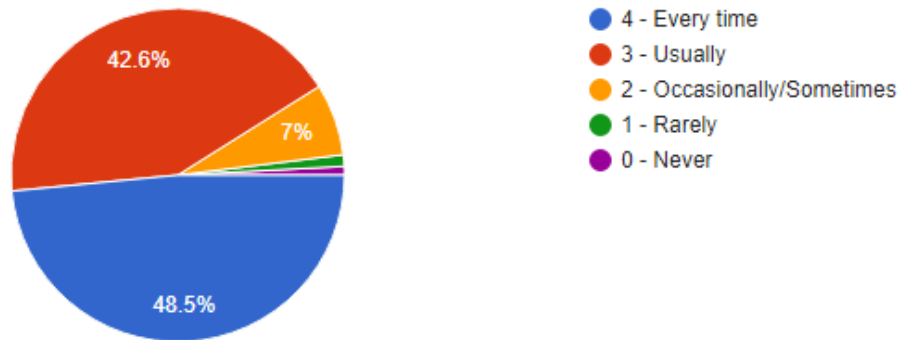


Analysis

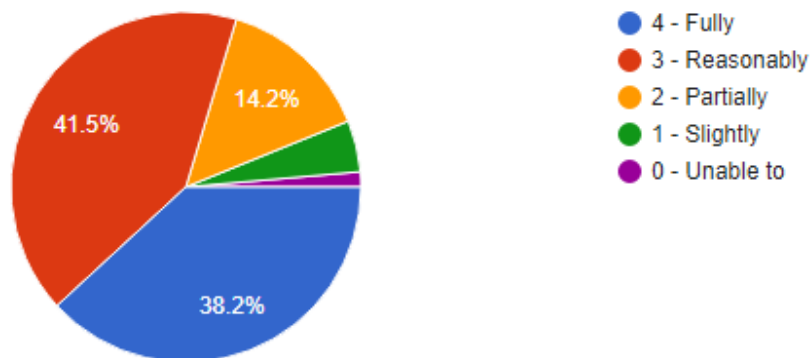


Analysis

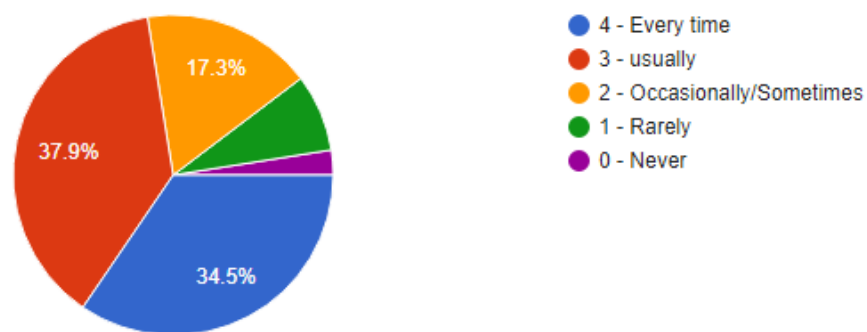


Analysis

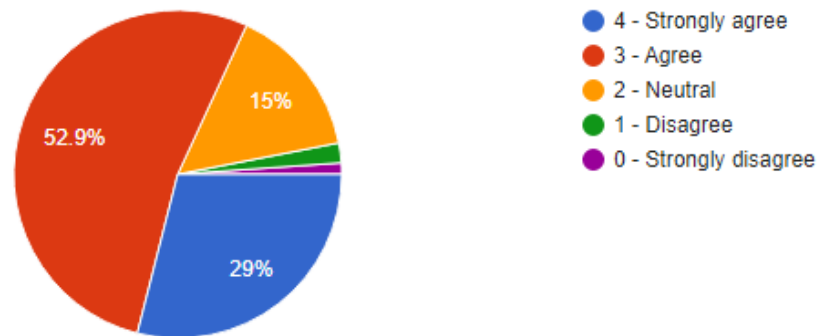


Analysis

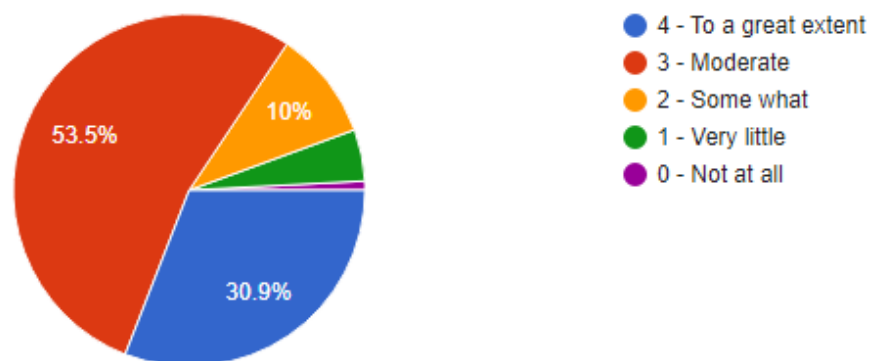


Analysis

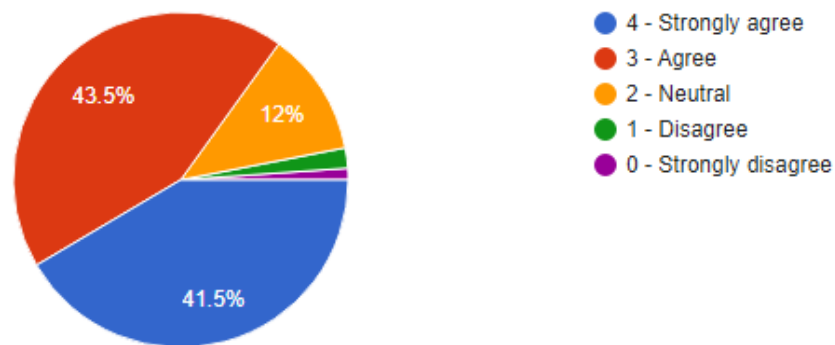


Analysis

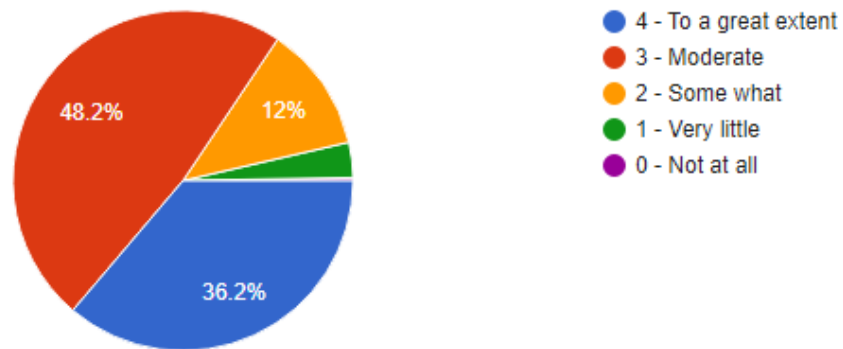


Analysis

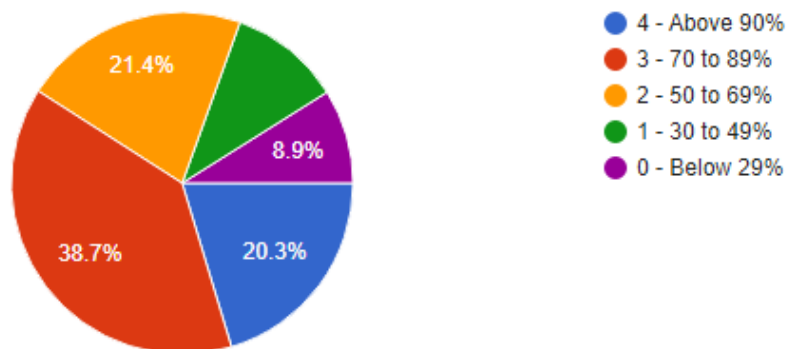


Analysis

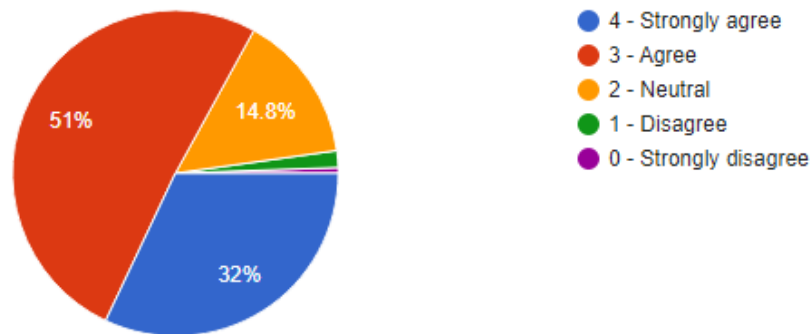
Analysis

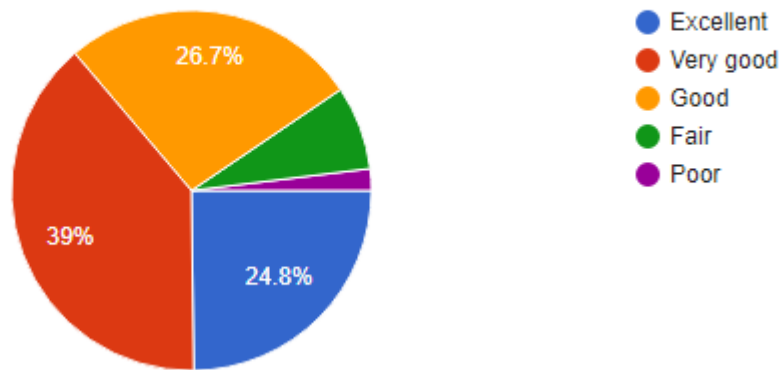


Analysis

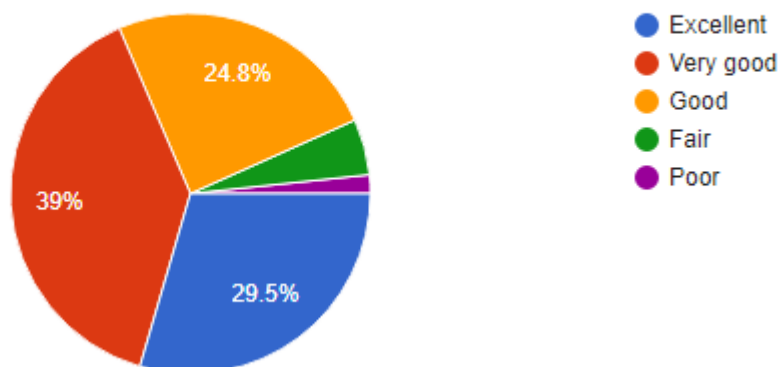


Analysis

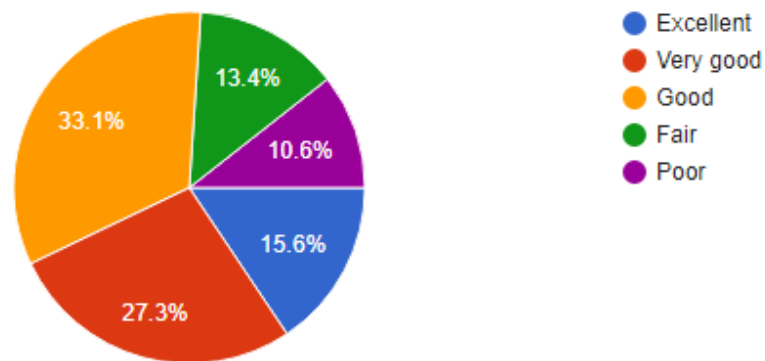


Analysis

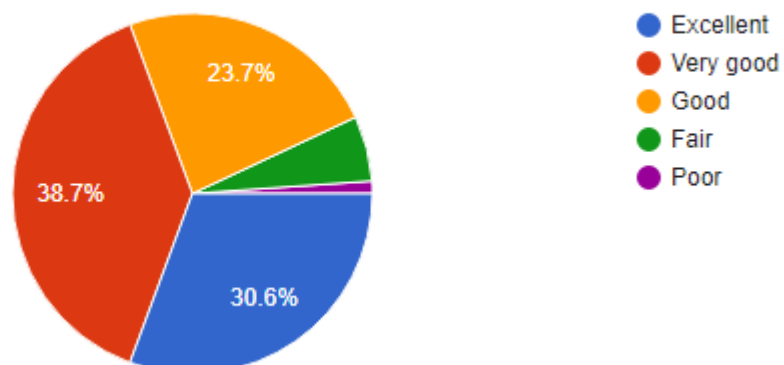


Analysis

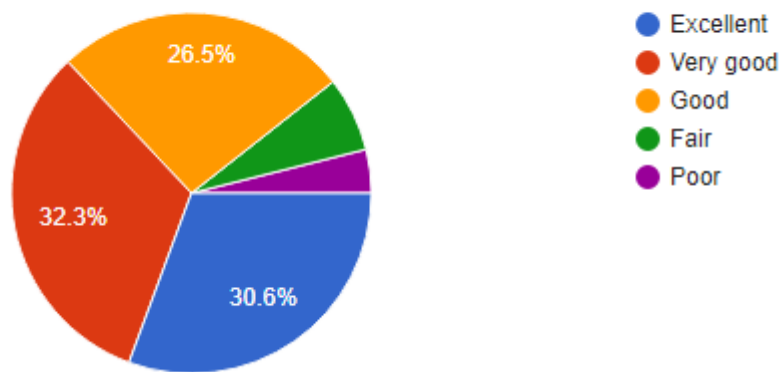

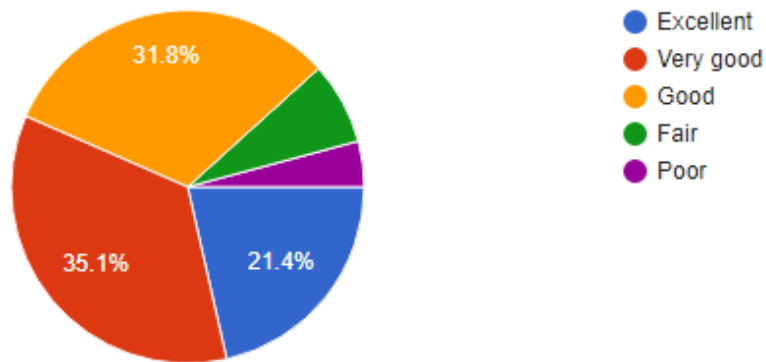


Analysis

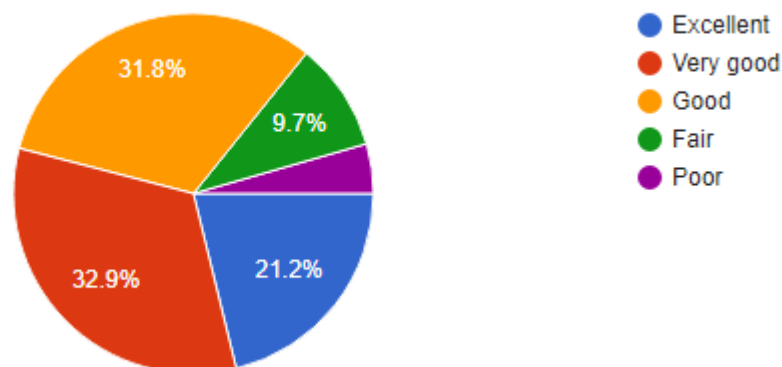


Analysis
