
<u>Analysis Report of feedback received from various</u> <u>Stakeholders – AY 2022-23</u>

To identify areas for improvement and assess the college's strengths and weaknesses, feedback from various stakeholders has been actively sought and received.


Analysis Report of feedback received from Students

Data Collection and analysis

The college made an effort to gather feedback from its students regarding teaching and the syllabus, with a total of 431 students providing responses. To ensure comprehensive results, percentages were utilized for effective comparison and analysis. The data collection process involved the creation and distribution of a Google form to students across all programs. The following details outline the analysis conducted.




A total 431 responses were received across all the programs, out of which 27.6% are from B. Com, 52.4% from BCA and others are from BBA, M.Com and BBA Aviation management.


The above pie chart represents the quality of the syllabus and the curriculum perceived by the students of their respective courses. According to this 14.6% of the students has perceived the students to be excellent, 35.5% of the students consider as very good and 40.6% as good. Only 8.8% of them perceived as fair.












Analysis


Opportunities for out of classroom learning (Guest Lectures, Seminars, Workshops, Conferences , Competitions, Industrial Visit, Internships)

According to the above response, 12.5% of the responses record as excellent, 27.8% show as very good, 31.6% of them responds as good, 19.5% of them has responded as fair and 8.6% as poor.



Analysis

The above chart indicates the overall experience in learning of the students of all programs and courses. According to the above response, 14.6% of the responses record as excellent, 31.8% show as very good, 38.7% of them responds as good.

12.3% of them has responded as fair and balance as poor.

Major Observations and Recommendations

- The majority of students appreciate the quality of the syllabus and its content, which aligns with the affiliated BCU university standards.
- Over 80% of faculty members have successfully completed the syllabus within the stipulated time, with efforts to ensure a 100% completion rate.
- While more than 85% of students find the course delivery satisfactory, a small portion rates it as fair/poor, indicating a need for continuous improvement.
 Program-specific initiatives are underway to enhance the quality of course delivery.
- Teaching aids and ICT are integral to the teaching pedagogy, with a considerable percentage of students accepting this approach. Faculty members are recommended to continue using ICT alongside traditional methods.
- The institution maintains a fair process for assessing student performance, but there is a marginal section of students with dissenting views. Measures are being taken to ensure 100% acceptance of the assessment process.
- Research activities at the undergraduate level pose a challenge, but the college
 has successfully initiated workshops, encouraged students to prepare and
 present research papers, gaining acceptance across all programs. The
 recommendation is to continue with engaging activities.
- Despite being affiliated with BCU, the college introduced add-on courses on emerging technologies, receiving positive feedback from students, although a fringe section may find it burdensome.
- Ample opportunities for out-of-classroom learning are appreciated by students, and it is recommended to continue and expand such activities.

Action Taken


 Despite being affiliated with BCU, the college introduced additional courses in Emerging technologies to address potential gaps.

- The use of ICT-enabled classrooms has been expanded to maximize its effectiveness.
- Students are actively encouraged and supported in presenting and publishing papers, with some already achieving publication.
- Measures have been implemented to ensure fairness in the assessment process.
- Ongoing efforts to enhance the overall effectiveness of faculty members are being pursued in response to student feedback.


<u>Analysis Report of the Feedback received from Faculty Members</u>







Analysis
















Analysis

I have the freedom to propose, modify, suggest and incorporate new topics in the syllabus through proper forum ²⁵ responses







Analysis

Major Observations and Recommendations

- The majority of respondents believe that the syllabus contributes to the enhancement of knowledge and subject expertise.
- A significant number of respondents indicate their ability to incorporate new teaching techniques, educational tools, and strategies, including the utilization of e-learning resources for students.
- Most respondents express limited scope to alter the syllabus but acknowledge the freedom to employ various teaching pedagogies.
- It is noted that a majority of respondents have taken steps to assist both slow and advanced learners. However, there is room for improvement through

regular assignments and increased focus on slow learners to enhance overall institutional results.


Action Taken

- Implementation of peer teaching and remedial coaching has been introduced to support slow learners.
- The continued use of ICT-enabled teaching methods by teachers.
- Recognizing the infrequency of syllabus revisions by the University (once in 4-5 years), the College has introduced contemporary and job-oriented add-on and certificate courses.
- Faculty members representing the college at the Board of Studies (BOS) actively work to communicate and implement necessary changes.


Analysis Report of the feedback received from Employers


Data Collection and analysis

The data has been collected from 06 respondents, out of that 66.7 % of employers strongly agree that technical knowledge of the students are good. Meanwhile, 33.3% agreed to the statement.







Analysis

The Students are able to work as a part of the team. 6 responses





The above chart says that the communication skills of the students are good. The respondents 33.3% strongly agreed to the statement and 66.7% agreed to the statement.




Analysis


• Introduction of Personality Development and Communication courses to foster overall personality development among students.


- Implementation of Emerging Technology courses aligning with industry requirements.




<u>Analysis</u>


strongly agreed and disagreed to the statement.


Sufficient number of Co-curricular activities were arranged during my study period 30 responses







Analysis

faculty members and institution helped in placing them. Likewise, 10% disagreed towards the statement and 6.7% strongly disagreed.













The Curriculum accommodates courses with experiential learning (Hands-on) 30 responses

Major Observations / Recommendations

- More than 90% of students agree that the curriculum and syllabus content are suitable for both placement and higher education.
- A majority of alumni express high satisfaction with the co-curricular activities provided, but there is room for improvement in this area.
- Most alumni agree that the institution and faculty members played a significant role in their placement, but there is a need for improvement, especially through industry-academic collaboration and internships.
- While almost all respondents appreciate experiential learning, there is room for improvement in this aspect. The learning environment is generally appreciated by the majority.
- Most respondents agree that the institution is student-centric, but there is a suggestion to focus on competitive exam training and career counseling.

Actions Taken

- The college prioritizes alumni engagement, conducting regular alumni meets and interactions as an integral part of the academic endeavor.
- Establishment of various activity centers aimed at overall student improvement.
- The Training and Placement Centre actively utilizes its network for campus recruitment and collaborates with more companies to enhance placement opportunities.
- Introduction of regular add-on and certificate courses based on emerging technologies to provide students with relevant skills.
