- He has contributed over 300 tutorials, spanning both Sanskrit and Kannada, to the Spoken Tutorial project at IIT Mumbai.

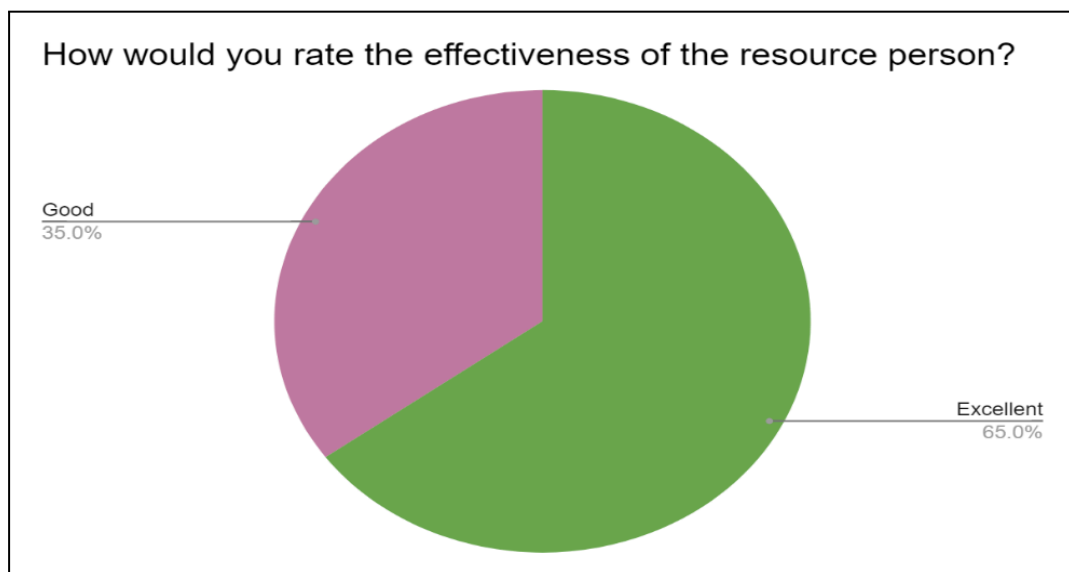
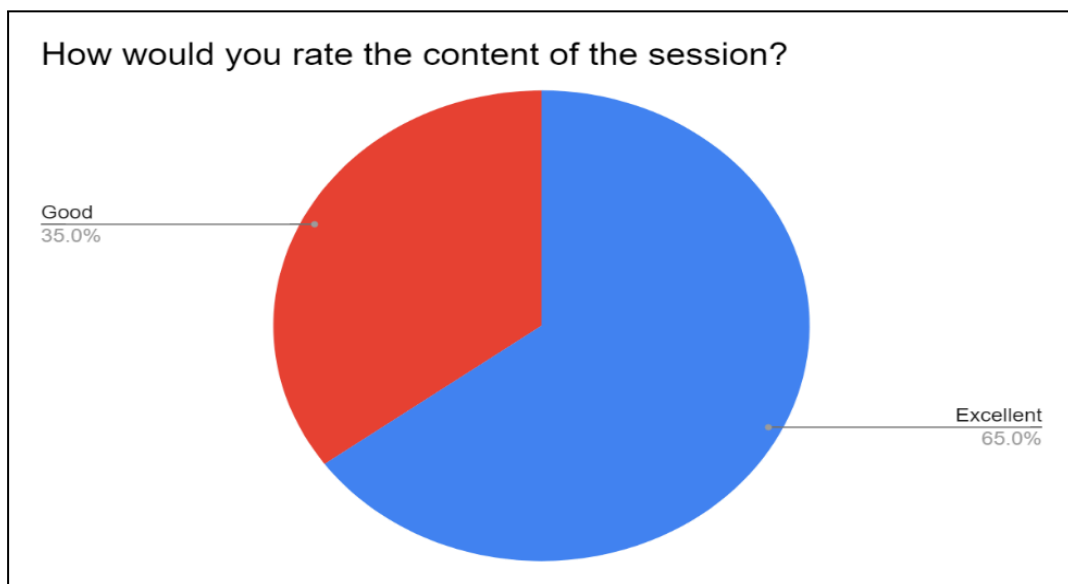
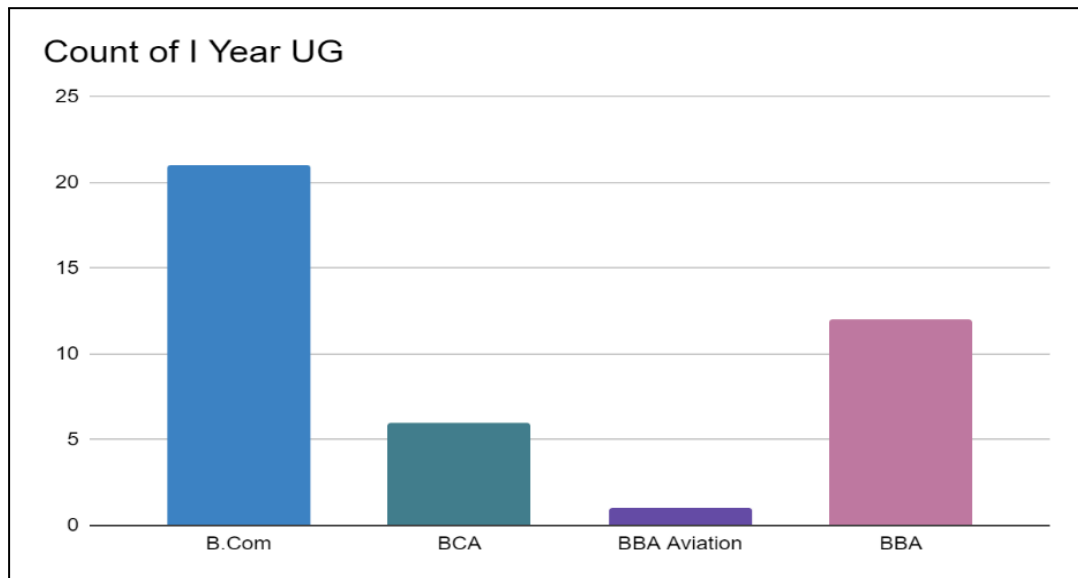

The Panchatantra (Five Principles) is an ancient Indian inter-related collection of animal fables in verse and prose, in a frame story format. The original Sanskrit work, which some scholars believe was composed in the 3rd century BCE is attributed to Vishnu Sharma.

It is based on older oral traditions, including animal fables that are as old as we are able to imagine, including the Buddhist Jataka Tales. It is certainly the most frequently translated literary product of India, and these stories are among the most widely known in the world.


